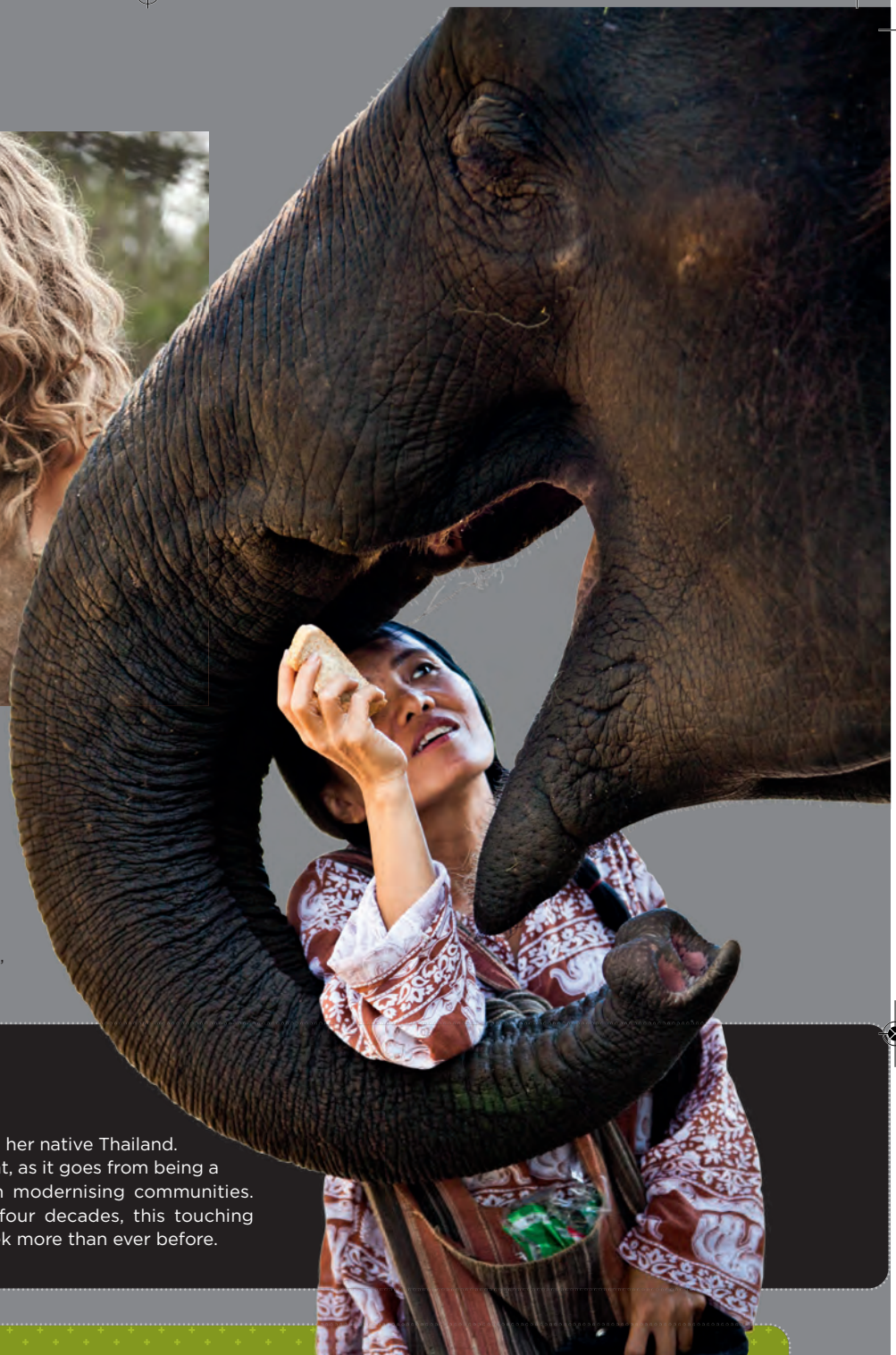


the extraordinary tale of william buckley
